

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Native American Youth Entrepreneur Camp (NAYEC)

Question: What is the age requirement for attending the camps? Answer: Ages 16-18. Students must complete their sophomore year of high school prior to attending the camp; high school students that are juniors, seniors, including recent high school graduates, are qualified to attend the camp.

Question: Are meals provided during the camps? Answer: Yes, all meals are provided, including breakfast, lunch, and dinner during the camp. Small snacks are provided during the classroom breaks.

Question: Are students supervised throughout the camp? Answer: Yes, from the time the student has checked in for the camps, staff members are on site with the student. Staff members stay in the residence halls with students throughout camp, including all on-campus and off-campus events and field trips.

Question: Are airline flights covered in the tuition? Answer: No, parents or sponsored organizations are responsible for all travel to and from the city of Tucson. Camp staff members will provide shuttle services to and from the Tucson International Airport.

Question: How much does it cost to attend the camp? Answer: The cost is \$750.00 to attend the camps. This includes tuition, room and board, meals, and supplies. An additional \$25.00 processing fee is required.

Question: Are there any scholarships available to cover the cost of the camp? Answer: Yes, parents must contact NNI for additional information on how to receive a Scholarship Application. Parents must complete all requirements associated with the Scholarship Application. Contact NNI at nni@email.arizona.edu or call **520-626-0664**. Scholarships are given on an as-needed basis.

Question: Can my child bring their own vehicle to the camp? Answer: No, students may not bring their vehicle to the camp. Parents or chaperones must drop off students to the residence hall during the time of the camp registration and must pick up students at the end of the camp.

Question: Are parents required to attend the student orientation? Answer: Parents are strongly encouraged to attend the student orientation. This will be the first opportunity to see the things the students will be doing during the camp, and parents can meet the staff members of the camps. Students are required to attend the student orientation.

Question: If my child gets sick, is there a health facility on site to render care? Answer: Yes, The University of Arizona has a Campus Health facility that is open during normal business hours. After hours, students are taken to a local Tucson hospital. Health costs are then billed to the parent's health insurance providers or to the parents. Students are required to completely fill out the Medical Consent Form with the parent's health insurance information.

Question: Is there a dress code for the camp? Answer: No, but students should wear protective clothing during the hot summer days. Tucson is located in the Sonoran Desert where daytime temperature can reach over 100 degrees. On the last day, students are encouraged to wear business casual attire for the closing ceremony.
