The Native Nations Institute for Leadership, Management, and Policy at the University of Arizona will hold a week-long entrepreneurship camp in July 2008, on the University of Arizona campus in Tucson, Arizona. The camp, which teaches business skills to Native youth, is limited to 30 Native American high school juniors, seniors, and recent graduates.

NAYEC is in its ninth year of operation and 2008 will mark the twelfth camp that has taken place under its auspices. This is an extremely valuable program that is intended to encourage private sector development on Indian reservations to improve economic conditions for Native communities.

If you would like to help ensure that NAYEC continues, several categories of sponsorship are available. Donated funds are used to offset the costs of the camp that are not covered by the registration fee. Sponsorships may also be designated for tuition scholarships, cash prizes, and special awards.
